
There is Something About that Name...

Several folks who attended the Bay Area Gospel Music Association (BAGMA) Christmas party this year were assigned a piece of the nativity scene and asked to talk about it. ARE DUE JANUARY 31st...

As announced at the 2016 STGMA Convention, the Board has voted to have the Artist and Associate Membership fees due on January 31st of each year. All fees paid in 2016 will be pro-rated in January of 2017 at \$4.17 per month for Artists and \$1.25 per month for Associates. So, if you paid your dues in May of 2016, your January 2017 dues will be \$29.00 for Artists and \$9.00 for Associates. These amounts are rounded up or down to the nearest dollar. Any new Artists or Associates who join in 2017 will also be pro-rated accordingly. You will receive a letter in the mail providing you with your pro-rated amount for 2017.

As of January 31, 2018 all fees will be due in the amount of \$50.00 for Artists and \$15.00 for Associates.


