



What is the real purpose of a music ministry? Gospel music should praise, testify and speak about the Lord Jesus Christ. Psalm 9:2 says "I will be glad and rejoice in thee. I will sing praise to thy name, O thou most High." Psalm 33:2-3 says "Praise the Lord with harp: sing unto him with the psaltery and an instrument of ten strings. Sing unto him a new song; play skillfully with a loud noise." Did you get that? When we are saved, God puts a NEW song in our mouth. We no longer speak about what we selfishly want but we seek constantly to honor Him with our words. The true result of salvation is PRAISE! It's something God puts within us. Plus, that's not all of verse 3. It says we must play (sing) skillfully. We have a responsibility to give God our very best. The word "loud" here does not refer just to volume but implies that we must do it with all our strength. Chapter 40 in Psalms goes on to say "And he hath put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the Lord." Isn't that awesome? Think about it. When our heart has truly been changed and we have a new song of praise, others will see the Lord through us and want the joy we have in Christ. That's shouting ground right there, folks!

Can praise music to God really make a difference? Yes. Think about Paul and Silas. They were thrown in jail and placed in stocks yet they weren't singing the blues... They were singing praises unto God! Think of the power of music.

Music can lift us when we're feeling down or it can bring a tear to our eyes. I once saw a sign that read "Where words fail, music speaks." Knowing it has that kind of influence on folks makes it even more important to ensure our songs glorify and praise the awesome God we serve!





lives to praise Him before man (especially on a platform shared with a Pastor), we accept the responsibility for supporting the gospel being preached by providing worship music that encourages the down-hearted, restores the faith of one who has turned away from God and gently guides the listener to a place where their heart is receptive to the Word of God being preached. Salvation comes from hearing the Word so our songs should contain scripture or be scripturally-based so it points folks to Christ. Gospel music should give all the attention and praise to the Lord and not to the music, the musician or the singer. It must come from the heart and not just the voice or instrument. It's not entertainment, a talent show or a performance...it's a ministry to the Lord. Be ready to accept the responsibility of carrying the gospel to those God puts in your presence. You may be the only Bible they see. It's interesting to note that before David was a soldier—he was a musician! Before David was a king - he was a musician! When the servants of Saul sought a musician to play before Saul because an evil spirit troubled him, they chose David! What did God say of David? He was a man after God's own heart. We must have a heart that seeks God. To show the Word...we must know the Word. Stepping onto a platform should be regarded as stepping on holy ground and we're there to worship and praise Almighty God...and Him alone.

WILL BE PAID EVERY JANUARY 31st...

As announced at the 2016 STGMA Convention, the Board has voted to have the Artist and Associate Membership fees due on January 31st of each year. All fees paid in 2016 will be pro-rated in January of 2017 at \$4.17 per month for Artists and \$1.25 per month for Associates. So, if you paid your dues in May of 2016, your January 2017 dues will be \$29.00 for Artists and \$9.00 for Associates. These amounts are rounded up or down to the nearest dollar. Any new Artists or Associates who join in 2017 will also be pro-rated accordingly. You will receive a letter in the mail providing you with your pro-rated amount for 2017.

As of January 31, 2018 all fees will be due in the amount of \$50.00 for Artists and \$15.00 for Associates.

Grandparents as Story Tellers


